



Dear Brothers and Sisters:

These are difficult and challenging times for the world and especially for the Christians, including many Seventh-day Adventist. One cannot help but recognize that we are nearing the Second coming of Jesus. One of the important questions that we all need to answer is "What is a Christian to do when faced with disappointment, disaster, and despair? Scripture teaches us that "all things work together for good to them that love God, to them who are the called according to his purpose" (Romans 8:28). Yet when we encounter difficulties, we often wonder, Why? Searching for answers and learning to view "bad things" as "good things in disguise" are disciplines that God wants His children to develop as they mature spiritually. (See I Corinthians 2:14 and Romans 8:1–17.)Then The Apostle Peter reminds us of the times in which we live He wrote ""Beloved, think it not strange concerning the fiery trial which is to try you, as though some strange thing happened unto you:" (I Peter 4:12).

The Apostle Paul elucidated on eight trials that most of us as Gods remnant people will experience in times like these. He describes them as follows:

- Fiery trials: intense encounters or struggles; bursts of anger, grief, or lust
- **Infirmities**: physical limitations and illnesses
- Reproaches: ridicule and rejection on account of faith or holiness
- Persecutions: harassment and oppression due to religious convictions
- Necessities: wear and care of daily responsibilities
- **Distresses**: disappointments and deep hurts
- **Tribulations**: unusual pressures and challenges
- **Temptations**: opportunities to yield to our sinful nature

The Apostle Paul regarded these "tests" as opportunities to grow spiritually. Instead of despairing when he encountered trials, Paul said he would glory in his infirmities so that the power of Christ would rest upon him. (See II Corinthians 12:9.) As we, like Paul, choose to trust God and accept the grace He gives us, Christ's character will be formed in us. Unfortunately, most of us respond with murmuring or complaining when we face hardship of any kind—emotional, spiritual, mental, or physical. However, through trials, "it is God which worketh in you both to will and to do of his good pleasure. Do all things without murmurings and disputings: that ye may be blameless and harmless, the sons of God, without rebuke, in the midst of a crooked and perverse nation, among whom ye shine as lights in the world" (Philippians 2:13–15).Perhaps the greatest reason God has for taking us through the trials of life is to bring us to the firm conclusion that we need God. What is God's purpose in giving us commands that seem impossible to carry out? He desires to work powerfully through our lives; therefore we must learn to depend on Him. God has the ability to protect us from every trial or distress.

He will grant us the grace to be overcomers. Do you want to be an overcomer? If you really do, Then, trust Jesus in full to bring you out of any situation that you may be experiencing now. Yours if faithful witness.

Let's share our faith with others every day

Maybe you're afraid to share your faith because you don't know what to say. Or maybe you're sharing the Gospel but nothing is happening; people aren't committing their lives to Christ. Are you doing something wrong?

You can't open someone's heart to the truth of the Gospel—but God can, by His Spirit. The Apostle Paul wasn't eloquent, but God used him because he depended on the Holy Spirit to guide him (see 1 Corinthians 2:1-5). God guided many others in the Bible as well—like Moses, who at first asked God to get someone else to lead the Israelites to the Promised Land, or Jonah, who didn't think the wicked Ninevites deserved God's mercy and tried to run the other way.

Remember that God does not call the equipped; He equips the called—and as Christians, we are all called to share what Christ has done. Some of Christ's last words on earth were, "Go and make disciples of all nations" (Matthew 28:19). Sharing our faith isn't just a suggestion, it's a command. And God is with us when we obey Him.

One of the best ways to share your faith is to live a godly life. Non-Christians often look at Christians as hypocritical because we say one thing but do another. Show those close to you that you care—spend time with them, help meet their needs and offer to listen when they have problems. You might not be able to answer all of their questions, but they can't deny the reality of what Christ has done in your life. If you find this is hard to do, perhaps God is speaking to you about your own need to walk more closely with Him every day.

Another important part of sharing your faith is to pray for those you interact with. If you can't think of anyone who isn't a Christian, pray for God to place someone in your life who needs Him.

As you deepen friendships with co-workers, ask sincere questions and truly listen in a spirit of caring as they share about their lives. When appropriate, tell others you're praying for them. (Then make sure you actually *do* pray!)

Make it a daily habit to pray as you drive to work or as you walk into the office; ask God to help you see your workplace as a mission field.

Pray for those who you would like to invite to the upcoming crusade and those who you want to see saved in the kingdom of God and begin now.

STEWARDSHIP MOMENTS

Where is the storehouse?

The bible declares in Malachi 3:10 "Bring ye all the tithes into the storehouse, that there may be meat in Mine house, and prove Me now here with, saith the Lord of hosts, if I will not open you the windows of heaven, and pour you out a blessing, that there shall not be room enough to receive it."

Storehouse

What does the term "storehouse" mean?

The term "storehouse" has become a contemporary term describing the place we choose to which we bring our tithes. It comes from God's call in Malachi 3:10-"Bring the whole tithe into the storehouse, that there may be food in my house. Test me in this," says the Lord Almighty, "and see if I will not throw open the floodgates of heaven and pour out so much blessing that you will not have room enough for it (NIV).

Where did the term "storehouse" originate?

The concept of storehouse began during the revival at the time of King Hezekiah when the people returned their past tithe as part of the revival. So much was brought in that the king ordered the construction of storerooms (2 Chronicles 31:2-11).

"The Lord declares that what a man sows he shall also reap. Shall we not, then, by our good works, seek to sow the very best quality of seed? In the last days of the old year shall we not make our account right with God by bringing all the tithes into His storehouse? Will any venture longer to rob God in tithes and offerings? In the coming holidays, let our gifts be not to one another, but to the house of God, 'that there may,' He says, 'be meat in mine house.' In place of spending our time and means in getting something to surprise and gratify our friends, shall we not turn all our offerings into God's treasury? Shall we not make a thanks offering to the Lord? Will those who profess to be Christians see this matter in its true bearing? Will they awake to a sense of their obligation to God, and render to Him His Own?" (Ellen G. White, Review and Herald, December 8, 1896).

How does the "storehouse" function in the Seventh-day Adventist Church?

The local conference office is considered the storehouse for tithe within the Seventhday Adventist Church. Tithe is returned through the local congregation and then passed on to the conference where it is distributed according to the policies voted by the world church. Most of the tithe is used within the local conference, and the major portion is used for ministry in the local church.

Some have asked, "But didn't Ellen White set a precedent by sending her tithe directly to others who were doing good work?"

When the topic is studied thoroughly, it becomes very clear that she practiced what she preached. The primary example used by some is the time in the years between 1900 to 1906 when Ellen White was in Europe and Australia. The Lord showed her that some of the regular pastors engaged in the work in the South were not receiving sufficient income. Her response was to contact the conference where the workers were employed, in this case the Southern Missionary Society, which was an authorized branch of the General Conference. Then she helped with her personal money. When her personal account was exhausted, then she used some tithe from her book royalty monies. She did not send the money to individuals directly. The money was placed in the treasury of the Southern Missionary Society, and was paid out in a regular and economical way to approved laborers who were engaged in regular denominational work.
