Dear Brothers and Sisters:

How often do you reflect Jesus in your interaction with people that you meet each day? Jesus said, "You are the light of the world" (Matt. 5:14). We believers are to be lights that shine in the world and dispel the darkness. However, like most of the things that are stated in the Bible, we understand them much better if we understand them in the context of the whole scope of Scripture. Believers are lights, but it helps us keep that in proper perspective when we realize that our light is derivative—we get it from God. We do not originate the light, we reflect the light.

The fact that Jesus said to the people, "you are the light of the world," (Matt. 5:14) shows us that he did not think of himself as the only light. We all have the privilege and responsibility to reflect God's light. In contrast to people and even the Messiah, who all reflect the light of God, God Himself is not "a" light, or even "the" light, God is "light" (1 John 1:5). In God is no darkness at all. He shines brilliantly and has done so forever. Isaiah said God would be people's everlasting light.

We live in a dark world, full of lies, hate and confusion. But God's Word tells us to "cast off the works of darkness and put on the armor of light" (Romans 13:12). While others are chasing after physical pleasures and selfish gain, we're commanded to live a different way—to "put on the Lord Jesus Christ, and make no provision for the flesh, to gratify its desires" (Romans 13:14). Jesus said, "Let your light shine before others" (Matthew 5:16a). He explained that no one lights a lamp just to hide it under a basket. A lamp is meant to be placed on a stand to give light to everything around it. Whether you're timid or outgoing, you're called to be a light to the people around you. That's only possible if you're taking time to interact with people and cultivate relationships.

When Jesus said, "Let your light shine before others," that wasn't the whole sentence. He went on to give the reason why it's important to shine: "so that they may see your good works and give glory to your Father who is in heaven" (Matthew 5:16b). Our goal should never be to bring recognition to ourselves, but to bring glory to God. There's a fine line between being a light and putting on a show to get attention. It's a matter of the heart.

Before you can be a light to others, take a look at your own life. Has sin dulled the evidence of Christ in you? Maybe it's time to stop, take a moment and ask God to reveal any sins you might be ignoring. If there's a sin you repeatedly struggle with, write it down and pray over it continually. Ask God for His forgiveness and help in changing your heart. We'll never be perfect, but we need to address our sin—partly because it impacts others.

People are watching what you post, whether they interact with your posts or not. Think about the things you've posted recently—articles, comments, photos and so on. Could they be seen as prideful? Self-centered? Rude? What's your motive? To put others down or make them jealous? Hopefully not. Aim to make informed, respectful posts that represent the One you claim as Lord.

We must allow God's "glory" through our life to be reflected to the people and the circumstances...which He allows to come into our life. God's will is not so much what we "DO" but, rather it is ever expanding insight into the basic witness God desires to develop in our life. As his children and representative to the world.

PASTORAL ANNOUNCEMENTS

Let us brake bread together in Holy Communion on Sabbath April 01.2017 during the Divine hour.

Who may participate in the Holy Communion?

An essential prerequisite for receiving Holy Communion is Holy Baptism with water. We practice open communion, that is, we share the experience with believers of other faiths/denominations that share in the belief of salvation by God's grace alone and in Christ alone.

We practice a foot washing service called an ordinance of humility, right before we partake of the Lord's Supper. The Old Testament's references to foot washing do not report a single case in which a superior washed the feet of an inferior. Abraham, it seems, did not wash the Lord's feet but did at least provide water for His feet to be washed (Gen. 18:4). But Jesus, God of eternity, stooped down to wash His disciples' and His enemy's feet. Foot washing in the Seventh - Day Adventist Church symbolizes before God that all differences of rank, status, race, gender, and age no longer count and we are all one in Christ.

In the Lord's Supper, the bread represents the body of Christ and the contents of the cup, the blood of Christ. The life of Jesus and His death are the only means for our salvation. By celebrating the Lord's Supper, we recognize that all attempts to save ourselves are futile. We are dependent on what Jesus has done for us, not on what we have done, are doing, or will do.

In light of the Cross all of our attempts at self-improvement and all our intriguing ideas of using the powers of the self in order to reach our full potential are useless.

Foot washing and the Lord's Supper are rich and beautiful in meaning. In them our Lord wants to meet us, and we want to be open to them for Him. When we meet to celebrate the ordinances, we lay aside all routine and whatever hinders us to listen to His voice and His story. We accept the Lord's invitation to His wonderful meal.

STEWARDSHIP MOMENTS All Giving Should be Sacrificial.

- 1. David said it. "I will not give the Lord that which cost me nothing!"
- 2. Mark 12:41-44 "And Jesus sat over against the treasury, and beheld how the people cast money into the treasury: and many that were rich cast in much. And there came a certain poor widow, and she threw in two mites, which make a farthing. And he called unto him his disciples, and saith unto them, Verily I say unto you, That this poor widow hath cast more in, than all they which have cast into the treasury: For all they did cast in of their abundance; but she of her want did cast in all that she had, even all her living."

The widow gave everything! Do you think she went hungry? Was she living by faith? Did she honor and love the Lord? (How many here today believe she went hungry that night? Please raise your hands)

Too often I have had people tell me they could not afford to tithe or give regular offerings to the Lord. The fairest thing in the world is giving to the Lord. God does not TAX usand leaves the amount to us.

Tell me dear friend....is it a true statement that a person cannot give to the Lord? It is amazing how much we say we believe, and how little we trust our beliefs.

- 1. Luke 16:10 says, "He that is faithful in that which is least is faithful also in much: and he that is unjust in the least is unjust also in much."
- 2. Giving is not a matter of what you have. Anyone, even Mrs. Carmichael, the widow lady, who I mentioned earlier, could give. One of our church members, who by the way did not give regularly, said we should not take her money...she needs it more than we do? What a sinful thought this man had and how immature was his thinking.
- 3. You make \$650.00 month as a widow and give a tenth of \$65.00 a month and another person makes \$1000 gives \$100 both gave the same in God's eyes. However, if either one gave grudgingly it was of no value.
- 4. I like the song, "Little is much if God is in it" The size or amount of an offering to God is of no importance in itself. The principle is that we give from what God gives us. You cannot give more than you have. Some would think the widow's mite was nothing. But Jesus said she gave more than all who have given great sums of money. It was not the amount but the condition of her heart that made what she gave of great value.
- 5. If you have a lot, then you give according to how God blesses you! The principle is that we give in proportion to how God has blessed us. Think for a moment, how can you give sacrificially to the Lord if you do not give generously no matter what God has given to you?
